Position Overview

The MYAC Host will serve as the first point of contact for all guests, staff, donors, and partners engaging with the Milwaukee Youth Arts Center. The Host will be the primary deliverer of MYAC's Culture of Hospitality, ensuring a warm, inclusive, and safe experience for all who participate.

Essential Responsibilities

- Greet all visitors, guests, vendors, and staff as they engage at MYAC
- Serve as primary customer service representative for onsite guests, students, staff, rental partners, and vendors
- Directly manage building reservation program and calendar and direct visitors to appropriate destination
- Manage phone directory; transferring calls and welcoming callers
- Oversee building security functions and safety procedures
- Directly participate in daily opening, closing, and reset procedures
- Manage postage, deliveries, and service calls
- Support and participate in room set-ups, services, and emergent needs
- Participate in stocking, ordering, and inventory of supplies and consumables
- Consistently demonstrate and deliver MYAC's Culture of Hospitality expectations

- One year of hospitality, service, or administrative experience
